

## THINGS TO DO ON ISHIGAKI . . .

- ⊗ **Explore the sightseeing spots on the island**  
The best way to see the island is via rental car. Please see the circle island course sheet for more information.
- ⊗ **Swim, relax, and snorkel at a beach**  
Beautiful beaches blanket the island...notable beaches include Yonehara, Sukuji, and Maezato Beaches.
- ⊗ **Eat Ishigaki Gelato**  
Located directly across from Tonoshiro Fishing Port... featuring flavors from Yaeyama
- ⊗ **Purchase an original shirt in Ishigaki**  
Many local stores feature their own handmade shirt designs and creations.
- ⊗ **Watch a live music performance**  
Find a live house which features live Okinawan music and dance away!
- ⊗ **Try your luck at charter boat fishing**
- ⊗ **Shop for souvenirs at Ayapani Mall**
- ⊗ **Enjoy some locally made “Ishigaki Beer”**
- ⊗ **Watch the sunset from Oganzaki**
- ⊗ **Visit the Yaeyama Culture Park (Nagura)**
- ⊗ **See Manta Ray’s at Manta Scramble Point**  
One of the island’s most famous diving spots is called Manta Scramble.
- ⊗ **Ride a glass bottom boat in Kabira Bay**
- ⊗ **Explore Ishigaki’s Limestone Caves**  
The caves can be found on the way to Banna Park.
- ⊗ **Have some drinks at a local *Izakaya* (Pub)**
- ⊗ **Eat a delicious buffet lunch at ClubMed (Kabira)**
- ⊗ **Taste melt-in-your mouth Ishigaki Beef**  
Some people say that Ishigaki Beef surpasses Kobe Beef in terms of flavor and quality.
- ⊗ **Take a sip of Ishigaki *Awamori***  
Different from Mainland Japan Sake, Awamori is made using a black yeast called “Koji”.
- ⊗ **Eat Yaeyama *Soba***  
Different from other noodle types in Japan, Yaeyama Soba is made from wheat flower and rye.
- ⊗ **Visit a Black Pearl Factory**  
Ishigaki is one of the two places in the world where black pearls are cultivated. There is a black pearl factory and showroom near Kabira Bay.
- ⊗ **Visit the outer islands**  
Ishigaki is excellent as a jumping point to the many outer islands. Ishigaki’s remote ferry terminal has ferries which travel to Taketomi, Hatoma, Kohama, Aragusuku, Iriomote, Kuro, Hateruma, and Yonaguni.
